A big Thank You to our Mayor Joy Zoopkow and Dawn Chrystian for giving your time to show us how its done. Pick up a shovel and voila, it's the beginning of the project. Stage 1 will be placing the corner posts at the North, South, East and West perimeter. These will be placed as soon as we can pound the posts into the ground. We will also install the planters for the poles at the same time and the solar lights will be added. The Serenity Garden will be looking for some large rocks/boulders. If any farmers have them, please contact Elaine at 780-603-9729. We will be working with Maple Park Greenhouse for ordering trees and shrubs. The Gardens will be a drawing card for our community. The outline is:

- The corner posts will be installed
- Work up the ground at all four corners for Small garden areas
- Work up the ground where it is low, add dirt
- Prep the ground for the pathway—We will need forms for the concrete pathway, if anyone has any to spare
- Move the artist boards– lower them ready for painting
- Boulders to block the back of the lot from vehicles and decorative areas of the garden
- Looking for a large fountain if anyone has one they are Looking to part with

In Response to the fire fee issue that has been brought up in Holden

Here is a list of the fire fees that have been set out by Beaver Emergency Services Commission. It was their recommendation that if you have any concerns to speak with your insurance provider on what your coverage may cover in case of a fire at your house. This isn't property coverage but would be what is covered for fire services. Do remember that here in the Village, the fire station is very close to a home compared to a home out in the county. Prices would of course be more the farther they would need to travel.
