BEAVER REGIONAL ARTS SOCIETY DISSOLVES

At a recent board meeting, the directors of the Beaver Regional Arts Society made the difficult decision to dissolve the society which means it will no longer be presenting performances at the theatre in Holden. The 40th. Anniversary celebrations during the 2019/20 season were interrupted by the cancellation of the final show due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Since that time the 2020/21 and 2021/22 seasons have also been cancelled due to the ongoing uncertainty with Covid-19 and the constantly changing regulations.

Over the years a large number of our patrons have been groups from Edmonton and other areas who have come by bus to enjoy the performances and supper at the hall afterwards. Without these groups our audiences are too small to make it financially feasible because artist fees have increased dramatically over the years. Our board members feel it would take a considerable amount of time and work to build up our patron numbers to operate successfully again so the decision was made to dissolve.

The Beaver Regional Arts Society board members are truly appreciative of the support during the past 40 years. Thanks to patrons, board members, volunteers, all those who provided the excellent meals and anyone else who contributed to our organization.
