

1977- Retired from RCMP as Sergeant at Surry Detachment Traffic Enforcement Section, moving the family to the home farm at Holden.


1984-1995 – Employed at Student Transportation Supervisor by beaver County School Board, Ryley.

2018- My Wife passed away and the farm was subsequently sold. 2020- Moved to residence in Holden.


We had three children who graduated from school in Holden and Ryley and later attained degrees from U of A.


Alfred Stavert -Councillor



"the province's most powerful monument"

- Dane Ryksen, historian

At the outset of Word War One, Holden was a thriving community of 500. Despite its small size, eighty of Holden's finest answered the call of duty to King and Country.

As the guns fell silent on November 11,1918 Holden had lost 9 of its sons.

The 71 who made it back home vowed to honour them. They selected the sculptor Frank Norbury for the project after seeing his sculpture for Red Deer's monument – a truthful depiction of the average war-weary Canadian soldier.

A native of Liverpool, England, he had also been a Major in the Royal Engineers and served with distinction in The Battle of the Somme and Battle of Passchendaele. For his service he was awarded both the Italian *Croce di Guerra*, and the *Order of the British Empire*. Frank Norbury knew the war. He knew how the soldiers lived and died.

Historian Dane Ryksen observes,

"Norbury's design for the Holden monument encapsulates that lived experience. Norbury's Canadian isn't square-jawed, steely-eyed, or sightly. He stands there exhausted, eyes drooping and tired, his collar undone and Small Box Respirator hanging at the ready. He isn't standing at attention, in memory, or in thrust. He stands alert, peaking precariously around rubble, clutching his bayoneted S.M.L.E. Rifle nervously in his left hand. He readies a Mills Bomb to be lobbed at the enemy in his right."

Alan Livingstone MacLeod, a photographer and historian with a focus on Canada's war monuments adds the Holden monument and its subject display a realism not seen in the country's other Great War statuary,

"The effect of the figure is instantly powerful, but rather than a glorification of what is depicted, it is somehow simple, unvarnished reportage: this is what war is all about. Soldiers are about to die."

Holden's cenotaph was unveiled to the public on Monday, June 4th, 1923.

Ryksen says it's unveiling was an important event for Alberta. "As a courtesy to the "many Holdenites at present residing in Edmonton," Canadian National Railways offered trips to the village. The ceremony began at 1:30 p.m. when "the G.W.V.A. formed up at the lower end of Main St. under the command of Col. Weaver and led by the Viking Band playing a martial air, marched to the main square of town where the simple but impressive unveiling ceremony took place." Anglican Bishop Henry Allan Gray presided

over the ceremonies. He gave a dedication and speech "listened to by a gathering of over 1,000 people.""

Holden's cenotaph was designated a Holden Municipal Historic Resource in 2014 and continues to serve as the centre of the community's Remembrance Day ceremonies.

Holden Drop In Centre

Starting November 2nd, 2021, the Holden Drop In Centre will be open from 1:30 to 4:00 pm every Tuesday. The Holden Drop In Centre has been seen as a venue for socialization and mutual support for many of the citizens (not just seniors) of Holden and surrounding area. The Seniors Club will be following the Restrictions Exemption Program (REP) as set by the provincial government. This means that anyone entering the Seniors Centre will be expected to show proof of COVID vaccination (or a negative test in the last 72 hours) plus wear a mask at all times while in the building. Refreshments will not be available but you are welcome to bring your own.




