Village News and Notes

A message from Administration:

The new Council has been in office for a few months and wants to ensure that open and transparent communication with the public exists. We want to share with residents to date with the most current information. Like many municipalities the situation in our village is not the best. Some changes need to be made in order to build up the Village of Holden as we are on our way to a precipice. It is our desire to sure that residents are aware of the Villages situation in the hopes that it will shed light on some of Council's decisions.

We would like to start out by sharing how our municipality is funded for those who may be unaware.

Our sources of revenue are: Grants, Services, Taxes, and Government Funding.

Grants: Unfortunately, grants are limited, not guaranteed, we must apply for them, qualify for them, and finally be awarded them. Furthermore, the funds used by an awarded Grant are dispersed specifically for pre-determined areas in the project.

Services: We as a village are pleased to say and advertise that we have our campground which generates a small revenue as well as brings people into the Village where it is our hope that they visit the businesses and facilities within the village.

Taxes: There are two categories which are Residential and Non-Residential


Government Funding: different programs that the government provides to municipalities.

An unpleasant truth is the village is struggling, as are most other small municipalities around us. The government has cut funding anywhere between 60% - 100% depending on the program, meaning that some programs have been cut all together. We have minimized the budget the best we can to do our best to keep taxes low and still stay functioning. The Village CAO has been working diligently to apply for extra funding, some of the funding that was available in previous years no longer exists. This puts us in serious danger of not having the funds we need to continue operating as normal. This means our municipality is in precarious times and steps have to be made to aid our Village to remain in good standing.

Another unpleasant truth: the various boards and organizations around the Village share the village's hardships. They are also feeling the pinch of these lean years. They are in need of help and sadly the village cannot commit to providing the financial help they are seeking. The Village request that you stay informed. Watch the council meetings as much as you can. Take interest in keeping our community alive - if you have some ideas of things that might help, share them with us, send us an email at cao@holden.ca. If you are on a board or part of an organization struggling - now is the time to volunteer, brainstorm, and fundraise. We cannot rely on what we have always done, times are changing and new barriers are upon us which calls for out-of-the-box thinking. We encourage all members of the village to volunteer in whatever capacity they are able and comfortable with. Please do not wait until it's too late and we lose these invaluable organizations!

This is not the first time the village has been through hard times, and it won't be the last. Holden was incorporated in 1909 and has survived multiple hardships and pandemics through its history. We made it because when things get tough, this community comes together! We are asking you to come together now. If you can donate to a local board or organization in need, if you can volunteer your time and skills, we can survive this together. Holden needs you!

HERITAGE RESOURCES COMMITTEE NEWS

Visit the Village of Holden's website at holden.ca and click on Our Heritage to find out more about the Village of Holden Heritage Program.

The Heritage Resources Committee was established in 2010 by a Village of Holden By-law to promote the identification and protection of historic resources in the Village. The committee worked with the Province through the Municipal Heritage Partnership Program and using grant funds, matching money from the Village and in kind contributions from committee members a consultant was hired to do the survey, prepare the Village of Holden Heritage inventory and to develop the Heritage Management Plan which establishes the process necessary to attain designation as a Municipal Heritage Resource.

You will see as you navigate the website that there are four registered Municipal Heritage Resources in the Village – the Old Village Garage, the Holden Museum, the former Lutheran Church that is now the Gallery and the Royal Canadian Legion Cenotaph. You will also find the Heritage Inventory and the Heritage Management Plan.

If you or your organization own a building that has heritage value and could qualify for historic designation please contact the Heritage Resources Committee through the Village Office. Heritage value is defined as the aesthetic, historic, scientific, cultural, social or spiritual importance of a historic resource. The heritage value of a historic place is embodied in the character defining elements of materials, forms, location, spatial configurations, uses and cultural associations or meanings. A resource with heritage value has significance to past, present and future generations.

Committee members most of whom have been on the committee since it's inception are President Christine Mackay, Vice President Peggy Nahirniak, Susan Tymchak, Dave Maruszeczka, Village of Holden Council representative Travis Schiewe and Secretary Amanda Cox, the Village CAO. 
