Council Updates

At the October 17, 2022 Regular Council meeting the following motions were made:

MOTION #24-10-22: MOVED by Councillor Cole to remove the stop signs at the North and South intersection of 50 Street and 49 Avenue. **CARRIED**

MOTION #25-10-22: MOVED by Councillor MacGregor to remove the stop signs at the East and West intersection of 50 Avenue and 53 Street and the East and West intersection of 50 Avenue and 48 Street. CARRIED

Due to the numerous complaints received at the Village Office this year, Administration thought it wise to remind our residents about the Community Standards Bylaw #2-2015. The purpose of this bylaw to ensure that the homes, yards, businesses, recreational structures, etc. in the Village are kept in good repair and the yards are kept tidy and free of debris. Free of anything that will cause your neighbour concern. A detailed copy of this bylaw can be found on the Village Website https://holden.ca/holden-municipal-bylaws/

As the Village Administrator, I would appreciate it if you would abide by the Village bylaws but more importantly, that you would value your own and other people's properties and help make the Village a beautiful place to live. If your Village residents need help getting a large item to one of the collection bins, please have them reach out to our Collections Department as they may be able to provide assistance.

Items acceptable for collection in this Program include mattresses, sofas, recliners, white goods (stove, washing machine, etc.) and appliances, tires and propane tanks.

Items that are unacceptable for the collection program include grass clippings, trees, tree branches, bags of household garbage, small items that would fit into the neighbourhood waste bin, and cardboard boxes. These items can be broken down and placed in the bin in the alley. Electronic waste should be taken to a transfer station. Chunks of concrete or cement must be taken directly to the landfill site in Ryley.

Fridges, freezers, water coolers and window air conditioning units are acceptable, however there is a \$25 charge for Freon removal. Urban residents will need to pay for the Freon removal at the local Town/Village office. Once payment has been made, a sticker will be provided that needs to be placed on either the front or side of the appliance.




